PRESIDENT'S NEWSLETTER: JANUARY 2021

Dear Member,

Last year the committee decided to change the format of our meetings in 2021. This year meetings will be held on alternate months, starting on 4 March, when Distinguished Professor Ian Reid will deliver the Founders' Lecture.

The Ernest and Marion Davis Library will open at 6 p.m. At each meeting, starting at 6.15 p.m., there will be a 25 minute tour of the Ernest and Marion Davis Library. The first of these tours will precede the Founders' Lecture on 4 March. The tour will show and discuss key objects in the museum's collection. There is no need to make a booking, but for logistical reasons, the number in the tour will be limited to 12. The first tour will give an overview of the museum's collection, but at subsequent meetings a different theme will be used.

There will be the opportunity to meet and socialise with other members between 6 and 7 p.m. The lecture will start promptly at 7 p.m.

There will be no dinners this year. There are several reasons for this. (1) The dinners were pleasant social events, but they required a large amount of time to organise each event. (2) There is uncertainty whether it will be possible to hold dinners this year in view of the on-going risk of a further outbreak of COVID 19. (3) The dinners were overshadowing the lectures. There should be greater emphasis on medical history. (4) Students, young doctors, and new members were put off attending the dinners.

We hope that the changes in our programme will stimulate more widespread interest in the history of medicine, especially amongst younger people: practising clinicians (medical and non-medical), medical and health science students, non-medical historians, history students and others. The meetings will provide the opportunity to meet other people interested in medical history, view and discuss books and objects in the museum's collection and attend a lecture on medical history.
