PRESIDENT'S REPORT

3 NOVEMBER 2022

When the Executive Committee met at the end of 2021, it was decided that we would not try to hold any meetings until the end of 2022. Most meetings in 2020 and 2021 had to be cancelled and some speakers had their lectures cancelled on two occasions. Next year we will be holding five meetings (March, May, July, September and November). The format will be one or two lectures starting at 7 p.m., preceded by a guided tour of the Ernest and Marion Davis Library.

Subscriptions

The Executive Committee decided to waive the annual subscription for 2022 as the Society had not been able to hold regular meetings. The committee has decided not to call for subscriptions next year, but it is important to recognise that the AMHS does need some income to cover running costs (rent, reimbursement of expenses for out-of-town speakers, website maintenance, stationery etc). Therefore, I encourage you to assist the AMHS in this way.

The Executive Committee

Although this is the first and only meeting of the AMHS this year, the committee have met every three or four months to ensure that the AMHS continues to function. We were unable to hold an Annual General Meeting in 2021, but there have been some changes in the committee since the last AGM in November 2020:

- 1. John Collins retired at the end of 2021 after serving on the executive for 6 years, four of them as President. His leadership and chairmanship of our meetings will be badly missed.
- 2. At the same time Jenny Collins retired as the Secretary. Jenny was the Secretary for 4 years. Her term as Secretary was marked by extreme efficiency, but always conducted calmly and pleasantly.
- 3. In June 2022 Peter Holst retired as the Society's Treasurer. Peter had been our Treasurer since 2012, a role which he fulfilled with great wisdom and meticulous care. He is a very popular and respected member of the Society. He has kept the Society in a sound financial position in difficult times.
- 4. Another popular member of the Society, Tom Miller also retired in February 2021 after a long spell on the Executive Committee. Tom played a very important part in organising and conducting our meetings.

Our current committee members are Neil Pollock (Secretary), Pat Clarkson (Treasurer and Archivist), Helen Taber, Judy Murphy, Tony Mark and me. Neil Pollock very capably took on the duties of Secretary after Jenny Collins retired and when Peter Holst retired, Pat Clarkson volunteered to oversee these duties until a new Treasurer is found. Tony Mark joined the committee at the beginning of this year. During this year Peter Stone temporarily stepped down from the committee but hopefully will be able to re-join next year. In the meantime, I have taken on the responsibility of organising the programme for 2023.

The current members of the committee have agreed to stand for election again, but nominations are very welcome.

Constitution
